CYM Rojovi Skhodyny begins Tuesday February 16th 2010



Sunday, 22nd November - Wet, Wet and very Wet! Mud, Mud and very Muddy! However, over 150 people braved the wet and muddy conditions to celebrate St. Michael's Day at our oselya "Karpaty". Apel was held on the slab of the Pomich building which once housed sleeping quarters.

Greetings were received from Holova CYM Australia & CYM Melbourne Peter Duma, Holova CYOA and Holova OUN

Stefan Romaniw, and Holova CYM Geelong Stepan Tkaczuk. Badges and ties were distributed to the yunatstvo who had completed CYM ispyty and those who were moving into another level of our organisation, giving their oath to CYM.

Mass followed in the hollow centre piece of the Pomich building, this offered some protection from the elements. Fr. Bakay (Ardeer) and Fr. *Verchovyna*29 November 2009

More than 500 people attended Verchovyna's annual concert on Sunday, 29th November which showcased over 140 dancers. Among guests were representatives from outside the Ukrainian community which included the Multicultural Association of Victoria, the Victorian Multicultural Commission, Ausdance, the Australian Ballet and the Member for Essendon, all of whom have supported CYM in various ways.



The concert began with a typical warm-up of a Verchovyna dance class but ends abruptly because a dancer questions the relevance of the ballet style warm-up for learning Ukrainian dance. The teacher responds and suggests a trip to the "Ukrainian Dance Museum" to learn more about the different styles of Ukrainian dance and its execution with the help of Verchovyna's particular style of teaching. The audience is taken on a journey with the dance class through a museum where each live "picture" transforms into a dance performance from various regions of Ukraine.

The audience was captivated. The concert ended with an energetic and exciting new HOPAK performed by the Elementary and Intermediate groups.

Over 40 people worked backstage, front of house, in the dressing rooms, in the hall, on the balcony, and in the costume room to help make the concert such a success. Cheremosh

- 35 Years -

Cheremosh began on the 9^{th} of February, 1975, under the conductorship of Mr. Marian Kostiuk, originally from England, as part of CYM Melbourne's cultural activities initiative. Prof. Volodymyr Holovko, originally from Ukraine, has held the position as conductor of the choir for the past ten years.

Since its inception, *Cheremosh* has been a highly regarded mixed-voice choir. It is composed of various ages and for some, it is their main commitment to the Ukrainian community.

In 1989, *Cheremosh* released a recording with half of the repertoire linked to the Millennium of Christianity in Ukraine.

Over the years, *Cheremosh* has performed both locally and nationally at various CYM and community events as well as for the wider Australian community including Iwaki Auditorium for ABC Radio National and Multicultural Arts Victoria, ABaF (Australian Business Arts Foundation) Awards and joint performances with the Ukrainian Cathedral Choir, Australian Catholic University Choir and the Melbourne Philharmonic Orchestra at St. Patrick's Cathedral.

In 2010, Cheremosh celebrates its 35^{th} anniversary. Plans are underway in commemorating this milestone later this year.



Cheremosh encourages former members to rejoin the choir in preparation for this year's event and welcomes all who have a love for singing to also join and be part of the celebration and commemoration of its 35 year existence, and part of its future.

Verchovyna 2010

The team at Verchovyna extend a Happy New Year to all! We are looking forward to an exciting new dance year which commences **Tuesday 9**

February 2010 from 5.45pm at the Ukrainian Hall Essendon. Both enrolments and classes will take place on this date.

Verchovyna teaches its dancers about the rich Ukrainian Culture through dance and also provides them with great dance training and performance experience. It is also a great way of making friends and keeps Ukrainian culture alive in the community!

Artistic Director Melania Moravski Dechnicz has written a Ukrainian Dance Syllabus for Verchovyna and all teachers have regular professional development in this syllabus as well as the foundations of classical dance.

Kinder Enrolments - Kinder classes take place 5.45 pm-6.30 pm on Tuesdays. Children are able to join the Kinder group if they turn 4 yrs of age by 30^{th} April 2010. If a child turns 4 before the end of Term 2 (ie by 22 June 2010) they are welcome to join after their 4^{th} birthday. Teachers will assess 'early starters' and advise parents if children are not ready for the group. Children will stay with their peers in line with school years, as they progress through Verchovyna classes. New enrolments will be accepted until 22 June 2010.


Fraser Coast Cultural Festival-Queensland

Verchovyna has been invited to perform at the Fraser Coast Cultural Festival which is to be held from the 19th March to 28th March, 2010 in Hervey Bay at the Scarness Foreshore Park, Queensland. The Verchovyna Ensemble (formally known as the Senior group) will be performing on Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th of March. The Festival includes a Parade of Nations, Public Entertainment, Workshops, and Displays/Cultural Presentations.

"The Fraser Coast Cultural Festival aims to achieve the widest possible support and participation of the region's communities, by embracing the idea of unity in harmony, by presenting memorable, stimulating cultural experiences, while also recognising and endorsing the valuable contributions of the diverse, progressive cultural heritage of all participating ethnic groups." The Fraser Coast Cultural Festival is an annual event. It starts with a Parade of Nations with performers and local groups in costume, intermingled with local bands. After the opening ceremony by local dignitaries and consuls of some of the countries represented, cultural performances begin. Stage bands and roving performers also entertain the many visitors. High quality cultural performers come from all over Australia intermingled with local talent. An International food-court and other food and craft stalls enhance the Festival atmosphere.

rebuilding Australia's Karpaty

WHAT'S HAPPENNING AT OSELYA KARPATY- JANUARY 2010

New Years best wishes to all CYM members for 2010. This year promises to be a very productive year in many CYM aspects, particularly on the Oselya front. I would like to bring all members up-to-date on what has been happening behind the scenes relating to the rebuild of the Oselya.

Since the destruction of the property nearly 12 months ago, the Uprava has been under much pressure to come up with a suitable solution which would see our Oselya rebuilt and be a place we can all enjoy again. There have been many stumbling blocks along the way, starting with delayed insurance payout, failed negotiations with VBRRA and Christine Nixon's office to accommodate and facilitate accommodation for trades people, cleaning and safety issues. and the most important, ideas on how best to ensure the property becomes an asset and not remain a liability, costing the Oseredok thousands of dollars per year with little return.

In 2009, the property was cleared of debris by the government at no cost to the Oseredok, site accommodation was delivered and installed, water was connected, new fences erected at very little cost, the property was cleaned and reshaped at a cost of \$60,000. In early 2010, the lake will be cleaned up, the power restored, and the entrance to the Oselya will be cleaned up from around the front gate.

Melbourne University provided CYM with conceptual building and landscape designs which offer better protection from future fires. These designs are being evaluated by the planning committee to see what is most practical from the building perspective and how this information can be best incorporated into the whole rebuilding process.

There are members who have been asking why we haven't erected any buildings as yet, wondering what we are waiting for and asking why we don't erect a shed. The reason being is we are looking for long term financial security in a tenant. The Oselya needs to become self sufficient by generating an income for the Oseredok, just like the Sydney Oselya does for CYM Sydney bringing in a substantial amount per year in rent. Subsequently, the Uprava has invited YMCA Camping to discuss a possible lease arrangement. If these discussions come to no fruition, the Uprava will approach ACA (Australian Camping Association whom we are a member of) and invite expressions of interest from other parties who run school camps in order to secure a tenant. We want to ensure what we build not only serves the needs of our organisation, but also offers a client suitable facilities to run their operations.

I understand that we need the Ploscha for CYM use; however, we must remember that the Oselya costs the Oseredok over \$13,000 annually in outgoings. The Oselya grounds, infrastructure, and what's left in facilities require regular maintenance and upkeep. With the lack of volunteer interest to take part in working bee's means the Oselya deteriorates into an unkempt state and we have an asset which becomes high in cost to keep. A tenant would take on most of the responsibility of the upkeep of the Oselya, as well as provide an income for the Oseredok. All negotiations will be structured to ensure that the Oselya stays in CYM's hands and the Oseredok has full access to the Ploshcha for our svyata, family weekends, tabory and other times of need.

The Uprava will not commit the Oselya to anyone if there is no benefit to the members or the organisation.

There has been a great deal of planning, discussion and sourcing of information behind the scenes to ensure that the Uprava has the knowledge and understanding to make an informed decision in the best interests of it's members.

There will be further updates in February.
